A key objective under the IMF mandate is to promote sustainable growth, which can be achieved by fostering inclusiveness, including of gender. **Stefania Fabrizio** is Deputy Unit Chief in the Strategy, Policy, and Review Department of the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and chair of the IMF advisory groups on inequality and gender. Previously, she worked in the Fiscal Affairs Department, the European Department, and the African Department. Her research interests include macroeconomics, public finance and fiscal institutions, trade, and she has worked extensively on policy issues related to the distributional implications of macroeconomic policies and reforms. Prior to joining the IMF, she was visiting professor at the University of Salamanca, Spain. She holds a PhD in economics from the European University Institute.

**Marina Mendes Tavares** is an economist in the Strategy Policy and Review Department (SPR) of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), and leader of the working group on the interconnections between macroeconomic policy and inequality. This group has developed the "Macroeconomic and Distributional Analysis Model" (M-DAM) that has been used extensively at the Fund to operationalize inequality in surveillance and program countries. Her research interests include macroeconomics, public finance and inequality. Prior to joining the Fund Ms. Tavares worked as an assistant professor at Instituto Tecnologico Autonomo de Mexico (ITAM) and she holds a PhD in Economics from the University of Minnesota.
